Essential requirements

3. Must have an understanding of forest research and consultancy, and the ability to promote these activities within the department.
4. Excellent communication and report writing skills.
5. Experience of teaching forestry or related discipline.
6. Demonstrated ability to achieve as an academic in a developing world context.
7. Must be skilled in processing data using GIS software application.

Desirable attributes

1. Have a very good understanding of academia including an ability to establish collaborative links with appropriate partner organisations.
2. Have experience of a range of different silvicultural systems, with particular reference to planted and natural forest systems.
3. Adaptability (*flexibility, adjustability, versatility*)
